Art of a Sentence

Our whole school focus this year is on writing. Of the many components of writing, it is hard to go past the importance of a well-crafted sentence. The ability to synthesize a complex idea, summarize, or distil a discussion in one single sentence, is essential for an author’s meaning to be communicated. To be able to write one sentence that conveys succinctly the writer’s message and meaning is an art form. This focus encourages students to be creative with grammar and expression, making every word count. With the protection of unlimited space and time taken away, students are encouraged to push their writing to let (as the cliché says) necessity gives rise to invention.

We are focusing on helping every student in our school to write fabulous sentences. If you want to help your child improve their writing, ask them to write a sentence 3 to 4 times a week along with their reading and number work (basic facts and tables).

Keeping up to date

To access this, you need to install the app on your phone or tablet, search for Freshwater Bay Primary School and then register the appropriate year level that your child/ren are in this year so that any year level specific messages can be sent directly to you.

The SkoolBag App and our Website are our two main forms of communication in the school. Thank you to all the families who have already registered for both. If you haven't yet we would appreciate it if you could register as soon as possible.
